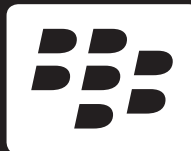


BlackBerry Smartphone Quick Start Guide (see other side for Windows Mobile phones)

1 Install Driver

Visit m.celiocorp.com/install on your phone's web browser. Carefully follow the step-by-step, on-screen instructions to download and install the REDFLY software driver over-the-air directly to your BlackBerry. You'll know installation is complete after you receive a pop-up window on your BlackBerry's display saying, "The application was successfully installed." Click the "OK" button on the BlackBerry pop-up message then continue to Step 2 in this guide.



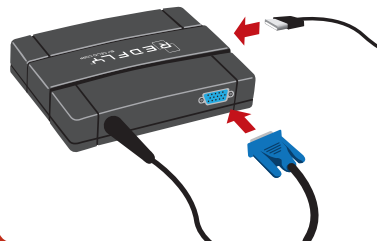
2 Turn On

Make sure your phone is on. Plug the REDFLY Mobile Dock into the power supply



3 Connect

Connect the REDFLY Mobile Dock to an external monitor, keyboard and mouse using the VGA connector and USB ports. You will see the REDFLY System Tray appear on the lower right hand side of the display.



4 Plug In

Connect your smartphone to the REDFLY Mobile Dock using the USB cable that came with your phone. You should see your smartphone's screen appear on the connected monitor.



REDFLY System Tray



To open the REDFLY system tray, move your mouse cursor to the lower right hand corner of the display and click the left mouse button. From here, you can select the following:

Home: This returns you to the main screen of your smartphone.

Mail: This takes you to your smartphone's email application.

Internet: This opens an internet browser session on you smartphone.

Send: This takes you to your smartphone's phone dialer interface.

End: This ends a call and takes you back to the smartphone's home screen.

Bluetooth: This establishes a Bluetooth connection with a smartphone that is paired with the REDFLY Mobile Dock. (See Bluetooth setup instructions for more details.)

Bluetooth Search: This opens a dialog from which to begin the Bluetooth pairing process.

Display mode resolution: This allows you to change the resolution of the connected display monitor.

Important Tips and Information

Primary Keyboard Shortcuts



The **menu key** on the USB Keyboard will have the same functionality as the BlackBerry Logo Menu key on your BlackBerry. Depending on your keyboard, the Menu key may have an icon, such as the Windows logo, or it may simply be labeled Menu.

Use the **Esc key** or the **right mouse button** as you would use the Back key on the BlackBerry.



Use the attached keyboard's **Left-Right-Up-Down arrow keys** the same way you use the BlackBerry trackball for navigation.



The **left mouse button** is the equivalent of pressing down on the BlackBerry trackball.

Bluetooth

The recommended method for connecting REDFLY Mobile Dock to a BlackBerry is over USB. While a Bluetooth connection is supported, it results in slower performance.

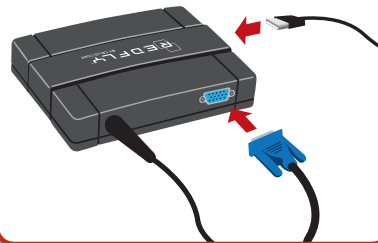

Bluetooth Set-up and Pairing Instructions

Here you'll find optional instructions for connecting REDFLY to your smartphone via wireless Bluetooth. No USB cable is required to set up or use REDFLY if you follow the instructions below.

Step 1: Install Driver

Make sure you've followed Step 1 in the easy set-up instructions above to download and install the REDFLY driver to your phone. If you've already installed the REDFLY driver to your phone, go to Step 2 below.

Step 2: Enable Bluetooth on Your Phone

A: Go to the **Start Menu**, choose **Settings**.

B: Click on the **Connections** tab at the bottom and choose **Bluetooth**.

C: Click the **Mode** tab and make sure **Both Checkboxes** are checked.

D: Click **OK** to save the Bluetooth settings.

Step 3: Pair

A: Plug in your REDFLY Mobile Dock to the power supply and select the Bluetooth Search icon from the REDFLY System Tray.

B: Choose **your phone** when it appears in the list on the screen and click **Connect** to begin the pairing process.

C: An authentication window on the screen will appear displaying a **4-digit code**.

D: Click **Yes** when asked for permission to connect to REDFLY Mobile Dock. Enter the **4-digit code** from the REDFLY Mobile Dock into your phone when prompted and click **Next**. Click **Done**, **Finish** or **Save** when asked to complete the pairing process.

Step 4: Connect

First-time setup is now complete and you are ready to connect to REDFLY anytime over Bluetooth. To connect, make sure your phone and the Mobile Dock are powered on and select the Bluetooth icon from the REDFLY Status Tray.
